



The Multi-Faces of IPV Across the Prairie Provinces: Men as Victims

In partnership with the Men's Resource Centre – a program of the Laurel Centre, RESOLVE (a family violence research centre at the University of Manitoba) is conducting a study on men who have experienced intimate partner violence (IPV). We are interested in learning about the nature and consequences of IPV incidents, men's experience of help-seeking and gaps and challenges experienced by men who do seek help.

We would like men to participate in an interview. To be eligible to participate in this study, men must be 18 years of age or older and have experienced violence/abuse (physical, emotional, financial, sexual) in an intimate relationship.

The interviews will take 60 to 90 minutes to complete and will be conducted in a private room at the Men's Resource Centre or the University of Manitoba in Winnipeg. For participants who reside outside of Winnipeg, the interviews will be conducted over the telephone.

Your participation in an interview and any information that could identify you personally will be kept confidential. An honorarium is available for interview participants.
